

## Caravan & Camping Emergency Action Card



### 1. FIND A PLACE TO SHELTER

Sheltering in a tent or caravan will only give limited protection. Establish if there is a brick build structure in which to take shelter nearby.

If not then shelter in another enclosed structure or vehicle. Once in a building or vehicle, close windows and doors and shut down ventilation and air conditioning systems.



### 2. TRY NOT TO USE MOBILE TELEPHONES

Unless you need urgent help.



### 3. LISTEN TO LOCAL RADIO & MONITOR SOCIAL MEDIA

BBC Radio Cumbria 104.1 MHz  
FM 206m (1458KHz) MW  
or CFM on 103.4 MHz FM.  
Cumberland Council & Police  
Social Media (see overleaf).



### 4. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO LEAVE THE AREA

Remain indoors.



### 5. FOLLOW EMERGENCY SERVICES ADVICE

## SIREN

- If you hear the Sellafield site siren (foghorn), follow the instructions on this action card. If in any doubt on what is occurring go indoors and call the Sellafield Information Line: **0808 909 8090**.
- Please note that the siren is not used to sound the 'all clear'. The end of an emergency at the Site will be announced on local radio or via the public telephone warning system.
- If you wish to hear what the (foghorn) siren sounds like dial: **0800 022 4191** to hear a recording.

**If you wish to register on the free Sellafield Public Telephone Warning System enabling you to receive alerts if there is an incident at Sellafield, then please use this QR code.**

# Additional Information

### 1. FIND SHELTER AND STAY THERE

- Find shelter. A brick club house or other brick building is preferable. Otherwise, if possible, find another enclosed structure with good building cladding, door and window fittings, or a portacabin to shelter in.
- Sheltering in a caravan or tent would only give you limited protection from the worst effects of a radioactive or chemical release. Stay there and follow advice on this card.
- If in a building, close windows and doors. Turn off air conditioning and ventilation systems.
- Damp down/put out fires. You will be safer indoors and protected from the worst effects of a radioactive or chemical release.

### 2. TUNE IN

Listen to local radio (BBC Radio Cumbria 104.1 MHz FM 206m (1458 KHz) MW or CFM on 103.4 MHzFM), TV channels, news websites, Sellafield website <https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/sellafield-ltd> and Twitter accounts @CumberlandCouncil @cumbriapolice

### 3. DO NOT USE TELEPHONES (unless you need urgent help)

- This will help to keep phone lines clear for emergency use.
- Do not phone the emergency services unless you need urgent help.
- If you have to make a call use a landline phone and be brief, or send a text message.
- Please do not make mobile phone calls as the systems will become overloaded during an emergency.

### 4. LET SOMEONE KNOW YOU ARE SAFE

If you can text or email someone to let them know you are safe, then do so. Avoid using mobile phones for calls unless urgent.

### 5. STAY IN AND DO NOT LEAVE THE AREA

There could be serious traffic congestion and you will be much safer indoors. Only leave the area if you are advised to do so by the emergency services.

### 6. EVACUATION

If evacuation is required then the emergency services will notify the site of which Reception Centre you should travel to in order to register.
